



Wyoming Episcopal Foundation Hunger Grant

In early December the Wyoming Episcopal Foundation offered up to \$5,000 to each of the 46 churches, to find "Hunger" needs of any kind in their community, to be paid out by March 1st. St. Thomas' asked Mary Ellen Honsaker, working with the Christmoose children's program, to look at this. Calling the school, she found that teachers often bought energy snacks and materials for lessons use as needed, out-of-pocket, to have in the classroom. So "Hunger for good Education" led to a "Snack Fund" available to teachers for any of their needs. Also the Food Bank Christmas Boxes are not put together like Thanksgiving to have special things for a Holiday dinner. So, led by member Sheryl Isaly, the grant was used to have 5 members gather in the Headwaters kitchen to bake 48 Pumpkin Pies to add to the Box, along with fresh oranges. Both "Hunger for Fellowship" and "Hunger for Holiday gatherings" was accomplished. St. Thomas' submitted a request of \$1,800 for these projects.

A week later Mary Ellen got a call from the Director of the Foundation. She said that "the Board was so excited about your ideas that they voted to give you \$5,000 dollars. Please spend it all!"

Thus, a Garden bench was purchased for the "Growong Hope" vegetable garden, with "Hunger for God's Peaceful Moment" met, an open gate for anyone in need. A partnership with the church Outreach and the Salvation Army completed a "Hunger for safe Shelter" by paying a month's rent for a single

Venezuelan mother between jobs. Oranges and candy bars were added to the Christmoose gift bags of children's wish lists for "Hunger for the Christmas morning Stocking surprise". The final two larger needs found were joining with Mountain Grace Church by purchasing snacks and warm drinks for the

Gathering25 Global 24-hour prayer time, February 28th through March 1st on their large screen. Meeting "Hunger for both Prayers for the World and Ecumenical Church relationships" needs. And lastly, the amount left, plus any snacks not used for the gathering, will go to Little Lambs Daycare, completing

a "Hunger for a safe place for young children, and worry-free working parents". Spending the WY Episcopal Foundation generous \$5,000 has been an adventure out into our community and a blessing for everyone involved. We will look for ways to continue meeting some of these needs.

Spring Cleaning


Jr. Warden Rick is asking for feedback on this year's Spring Cleaning.
